Undergraduate Internship programme information

Teaching schools have been given funding to support internships for undergraduate students in their penultimate year at university. The aim is to increase the number of mathematics and physics teachers.

Schools have been invited to provide opportunities in summer 2019 for science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) undergraduates to experience mathematics or physics teaching before they commit to it as a career.

It is expected the programme will take place at the end of undergraduates' penultimate year, and should last for 4 weeks.

The programme will offer interns the chance to gain a deep experience of teaching, and will include:

- a combination of supporting in the classroom, working with individuals or small groups, offering support for children who are struggling, and generally becoming involved in the wider school community and experience
- structured training, shadowing and lesson observation, followed by a chance to jointly plan and deliver lessons (if you want to!)
- one-to-one mentors who are good or outstanding classroom teachers in their specialism
- opportunities to network with qualified subject specialists
