1. Rag rate the topic areas within the three themes: (use your purple books) Identity and Culture/The World around you /Education and Work	2. Choose one of your RED rag rated areas and make revision cards for at least 30 new words	3. Use the grammar sections at the back of the purple books to revise specific tenses (especially present/ perfect/future/conditional)	4. Use Memrise / Quizlet or GCSE Bitesize. Choose a different topic area every week.	5. Modal verbs – use a variety of methods to learn these in all tenses and use past papers to identify them.
6. Use past exam papers –even if it is the old specification (available on Pupil Resources) to identify different tenses. Use the transcripts for this in the Listening exams	7. Make a set of 25 – 30 revision cards; English on one side and French/German on the other. Test yourself – get somebody else to test you	8. Make a different set of 25 – 30 revision cards; one word per card. Put them face down and play the Memory game	9. Make a different set of 25 – 30 revision cards; one word per card. Play speed matching.	10. Make domino cards – divide cards in two, have English on one half and French/German on other half. Make a loop
11. Hexagons – use the template in the shared area and make sets to match up. Share with somebody else in Year 11	12. Knowledge Organisers – A4 split into 6/8 sections and fill in with new words for individual topic areas.	13. LACAWAC- keep practising new vocabulary using the "folding" method. Ensure you use new vocabulary each time	14. Download and complete past exam papers at least once a week – keep doing them even if you have done them before. Available on Pupil Resources	15. www.lyricstraining.com use this to help match sounds to words – choose French / German
16. Choose a photo – imagine it is the photocard and answer "what is on the photo?" in French/ German Check the French/German photocard mats in Pupil Resources	17. Mind maps – choose a topic area and categorise the words. Eg verbs / adjectives / nouns etc	18. Use Spotify. Type in the kind of music you like listening to followed by français or Deutsch	19. Posters / Post it Notes of examples of verbs in all the various tenses – especially high frequency verbs	20. Posters / Post it Notes of high frequency words and little words which make a big difference.
