Cover sections of information with post-it notes and see if you can explain what is underneath, either verbally or written.</p>	<p>Go to BBC bitesize GCSE Eduqas, read through the topics for Christian beliefs and then take the test!</p>

Inside each finger and thumb, write down key beliefs/actions to describe them.</p>	<p>Draw and annotate the Hindu cycle of samsara from memory. Check against your notes and make any corrections. Blue tack it onto your wall to keep it fresh in your memory. Don't forget to include aims in life, virtues etc!</p>	<p>Complete the key word Philosophy & Ethics matrix saved in files on teams. The key word glossary is saved there too. Pop it up on the wall and test yourself with those definitions!</p>
