### If you have a concern about a young person:

- Contact the young person's Head of Year or
- Contact a member of the safeguarding team
- **If a young person is in immediate danger - Dial 999 and report the event to the police.**
- If you have a concern about an adult in school: **Contact the Headteacher or Chair of Governors in the first instance.**

The Chantry School recognise our moral and statutory responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of all pupils. We endeavour to provide a safe and welcoming environment where children are respected and valued. We are alert to the signs of abuse and neglect and follow our procedures to ensure that children receive effective support, protection and justice. Child protection forms part of the school's safeguarding responsibilities.

We are **proactive** about keeping children safe, promoting an ethos where children feel safe and are encouraged to talk and are listened to. We do this through assemblies, tutor time and PSHE lessons. We involve outside agencies when appropriate, and will also signpost pupils and parents to external sources of support. We explicitly teach pupils about how to stay safe, amongst other values we teach pupils about:

- Online safety through ICT lessons and with the help of digital leaders.
- Antibullying and cyberbullying
- Misuse of mobile technology including sexting
- Peer to peer abuse
- Child sexual exploitation
- County Lines
- Healthy relationships and consent
- Extremism, radicalisation and prevent
