Each page should include:

- What you **know** about that character. For example, their motivations/intentions, mood/feelings, relationships for each of their moments.
- context for their specific moment/s
- **Key quotes** from their moment
- Notes on their use vocal, physical, facial exp. used to convey any of the above.

Make a stage grid

(a rectangle split into 9 sections). Write down the nine different stage positions, cut out and test yourself with placing the correct stage positions in place.

Remember... know where your audience are and always from the actor's perspective

Pick any scene from the play, read and complete a 'Brain Dump' for a chosen character that appears in the scene.

Include the following...

What has happened to them until this point in the play? What is happening to them in the scene? How are they feeling? What do they want? What are the problems they face? What does this character go on to discover/experience in the remainder of the play?

Produce a quotation table.

Choose 5 characters, 5 quotes per character.

Column 1. Character name

Column 2. Quote

Column 3. Intended effect for the line Column 4. Key vocal & physical skills used when delivering line

Then, choose and highlight one quote for each character.
